- Fundraising: All activities must follow financial policies, with funds raised transparently reported.

### 4. Motion on Reform of Elections of Board Members

Reform of Elections of Board Members

- Candidate Presentations: Candidates present themselves within a time limit set by the GA chair, with members able to propose time changes before presentations begin.
- Preferred Candidates & IB Audit: The MoU presents preferred candidates and justifies their choices, while the IB audits the selection process and reports on fairness.
- Voting: For a single candidate, members vote 'yes,' 'no,' or 'abstain'; for multiple candidates, voters rank them, with elimination and redistribution of votes until one candidate achieves a majority.
- Election Results: Results are announced immediately after counting, with a detailed breakdown available upon request.

- Current § 9 will be renumbered as § 10.

- Candidacy: Secretary announces vacancies; candidates submit a CV and Motivation Letter.
- Voting: Ranked-choice for 5+ candidates, simple majority for fewer.
- Quorum & Nominations: If under three candidates, nominations are required.
- Results: Announced within 48 hours; detailed reports available on request.

- Guidance: While not binding, IB interpretations serve as persuasive precedents for policy consistency.

## 8. Motion on Resignation of IB

summary of submitted motion:

Resignation Procedure for Independent Body (IB) Members: Summarized Motion

- Resignation Process: IB members must submit a resignation letter with reasons and intended date, ideally two weeks in advance.
- Vacancy Procedure: If IB membership drops below three, the Board initiates a new selection process.
- Handover: Resigning members must provide a transition document and hold meetings to brief their successor.
- Removal: If a member neglects duties, the GA or remaining IB members can request resignation, confirmed by a simple majority vote.

Question: budget was not specifying the car rental, only gas?

Answer: we won't rent a car unless there is no better option

Question: would this come out of contingency?

Answer: probably no

Question: what is the ticket price?

Answer: For two days, 69 euros, wanting to increase to 73

Comment: Emergency services should not be dependent on everyone buying the tickets

Reply: 10% of income generated can be used for attendance for people who organized, make weekend more enticing for drivers by giving them cheaper tickets (no rental necessary), if no one is found, a car is needed

Question: if you sell the tickets to the driver, you don't need money for an emergency car

Answer: no, we do not want to rent the car, but this is the last resort,

Comment: by increasing the ticket price, you talk about renting a car or making tickets cheaper for the drivers; if you get drivers, then you don't need to rent a car

Answer: we absolutely do not want to rent a car if not needed

Question: if you're using the money to lower the price for the drivers when you're already giving them money for gas, cleaning and a gift - is that necessary?

Answer: a car is a key to get anywhere far away.

Question: could it just go out of contingency to add 120 euros to the cost of the overall

Answer; conservative budget is the one I am offering

Answer: you cannot bank on the use of contingency

Answer: exco has experience with organizing these weekends

Question: if you do not rent the car, you will lower the ticket price for drivers; but then we only can subsidize the 30 euros max for the trip

Answer: ticket price takes this into account

Question: By the four euro increase, how much would you lower the ticket prices for drivers?

Answer: we are expecting to come 30 people , 3 drivers to come - which is about 160 euros

Question: on policy, last year you were not allowed to have gifts for students - has this changed?

Answer: this has changed, now it is speaker and driver

Question: if there is an accident, who pays for the repairs?

Answer; full insurance on car rental, short budget but they try to make it happen
